

## Placement Rates

As part of the strategic planning process, an alumni survey is administered to graduates 3-months after graduation every year. Placement data are collected from those who respond to the 3-month-out alumni survey and graduates' employment and post-baccalaureate education placement information are also found through sources like LinkedIn, National Student Clearinghouse, and social media. Alumni with no employment information are removed. In 2021, this process yielded a total placement sample of 54%, in 2022 a total placement sample of 55%, and in 2023 a total placement sample of 50%.
